**Road Signage** We are still awaiting action on additional signage recommendations made over a year ago. In order to progress this important issue, I suggest a site visit with our SCC Councillor and a member of SCC Highways team.

**HGV's and High Street/Westerfield Lane** Village residents have raised concerns (and I have seen this too) about HGV vehicles entering this route and causing major hold up's and problems due to the street narrowness and parked vehicles. I suggest we should give serious consideration to an 'Unsuitable for HGV' sign at the junction by the Old Stores.

**Speedwatch and enforcement.** The team has not been active this year as I have not been able to give priority to this. I hope to rectify this over the next months.

SID's The Main Road SID has ceased to function and a volunteer in the village is currently investigating if any repair is possible. The shared SAVID SID is in the Main Road location and will be available to Tuddenham alternate months being shared now with Witnesham and Swilland, as Grundisburgh have purchased their own.

has continued its activities and giving priority to data analysing from the SID's. Our next meeting on June 1<sup>st</sup> in Playford village hall will mark SAVID's 9<sup>th</sup> year. The meeting will be open to the public and will include a 'workshop' focus on the SID data processing and analysing assisted by our advisor. Volunteers in our villages who are assisting with this are particularly welcome to the meeting.

**ANPR scheme** Tuddenham is now on the ANPR pilot rota. The device was in the village in February and although not located in the optimum position in Grundisburgh Road still showed 13% of vehicles exceeding the 35+mph threshold. I have requested its location in Main Road when it is due next in the village.

**30mph Speed Signs on Road side bins.** I have not been able to give priority to this issue since discussion at previous meetings.

**Quiet Lanes Project** We are awaiting the delivery of the signage and some changes to one of the entry signs. We will need some volunteer assistance with the sign installation.

Road Safety Forum and East Suffolk Community Partnerships Budget The G

The Group has not met recently

because of the local election process. The next meeting will be on June 12<sup>th</sup> which I aim to attend.

## Tuddenham Playing Field Garden Project – update May 2023

The seating and raised beds garden area in the Playing Field has now been completed and was the focal point for our Coronation Celebrations.

Thanks to Jim, David, Ian, Cathy & Sandy for all their hard work.

Funding totalling £2,200 for the project was provided by East Suffolk Council from our District Councillor Enabling Communities Budget and from the East Suffolk Community Partnership of Kesgrave, Rushmere St. Andrew, Martlesham, Carlford & Fynn Valley.

Phase 2 - We have spent £651.93 (£651.53) less than funded amount. It would be prudent to keep an amount in hand to replace plants as required. Also, we are looking at costings for more mature shrubs to plant near to the raised garden area to perhaps provide two "arbour" seating areas each side of the raised bed gardens. This will be discussed with Cathy, Sandy, Jim & David to work out viability & budget in the hope of proceeding in the Autumn. Signage – unfortunately I still haven't ordered the signage. I will now do this as a matter of urgency.
